Over the 2014-2016 period, our goal is to award ten young French pianists grants to participate in prestigious international piano competitions in the United States, and we have successfully started in 2014.

# A successful launch

French-American Piano, Inc. is a non-profit association designed to promote cultural exchange, education, and networking between France and the United States, with a special focus on pianists.

Inspired by a select group of the finest French and American pianists during the 14<sup>th</sup> edition of the International Keyboard Institute and Festival in July 2013, our "Piano Competition Scholarships" quickly shaped up late 2013 with the support of French diplomatic bodies , the prestigious Conservatoire de Musique de Paris and a small group of motivated corporate sponsors and members.

Three Scholarship have been awarded in 2014 to Matthieu Accar, Maroussia Gentet and Nathanael Gouin.

The Scholarships fund 100% of their participation to the two week International Keyboard Institute and Festival. Funding includes transatlantic flights, housing on the campus of Columbia University for two weeks and the Festival tuition fees.

Three Benefit Recitals have been organized to raised funds and build an audience and membership to support our Mission.

I am extremely grateful to the many patrons who have joined us in supporting the 2014 Scholarship Program. Their presence at our side will enable the success of our upcoming seasons

## January to March 2014:

# The Competition Scholarships Grants

### Why?

Young French pianists are under-represented in US-based piano competitions because of lack of funding, not lack of talent. Our goal is to reverse this trend, offering new professional opportunities to French artists and an enhanced experience to American audiences.

### Objective

Starting in July 2014 and for a period of three years, we will sponsor ten young French pianists through our Scholarship Grant Program, thus allowing them to participate in New York's International Keyboard Institute and Festival.

#### Grant

The grant covers round-trip transportation from Paris, tuition fees for the International Keyboard Institute and Festival (usually in July) and housing during the two-week festival. The program also includes a public recital at the France's New York Consulate in July as well as audition fees to the Young Concert Artists' Paris auditions in September.



# Hélène Tysman 2014 Featured Artist

Hailed as "poetic" by The Daily Telegraph, praised for her Chopin interpretation which "mixed excitement with eloquence" by the Gramophone Chopin Express, French pianist Hélène Tysman first broke out onto the international music scene as a finalist of the 16th International Chopin Piano Competition in Warsaw. A few years earlier she had been awarded First Prize at Darmstadt Chopin Piano Competition and was prizewinner of several international competitions in England, Germany, China and the United States.

A graduate of the Conservatoire national supérieur de musique et de Danse in Paris, she went to study in Germany with Grigory



Gruzman, her mentor for nearly ten years at Hamburg and Weimar Hochschulen. Since then, she has performed as a soloist and chamber musician across Europe, Asia, North and South America. Performances with such ensembles as the BBC National Orchestra of Wales, the Russian Chamber Philharmonic of St. Petersburg, the North Czech Philharmonic Teplice Orchestra, and the Minnesota Orchestra have brought Tysman collaborations with conductors Christoph Warren-Green, Mark Russell Smith and Antoni Wit.

A first solo CD in 2010, dedicated to Chopin's music was greeted with high critical acclaim; in 2013, a second CD of Chopin *Ballades* on the same label won the French Magazine *Pianiste*'s "Maestro Award". Hélène Tysman can also be heard on the 2012 *Indésens* chamber music recording featuring soloists of the Orchestre de Paris in an all-Schumann program. Eager to collaborate with other art forms, Hélène Tysman has shared the stage with renowned French actor Francis Huster in a program dedicated to Frédéric Chopin and Alfred de Musset; with the multi-disciplinary artist Yanowski, she also created a show devoted to Edgar Allen Poe and Claude Debussy.

# Matthieu Acar 2014 Scholarship Award

An eclectic musician who is equally at home as a soloist and chamber musician,
Matthieu Acar completed Masters' degrees in piano and in chamber music with Bruno Rigutto and Pierre-Laurent Aimard at the Paris Conservatoire. He is currently completing the highly selective postgraduate Artist Diploma course in Contemporary Music and Creation there.

Naturally curious and eager to explore all types of repertoire, Matthieu Acar has developed a particular affinity with the music of our time, one he delights in sharing with his audiences in original and often surprising programmes, as for example his participation in the American composer Julius Eastman's French premier of a two-hour triptych for four pianos at the



Parisian avant-garde Palais de Tokyo 2012 Triennial. He regularly premieres works with electronics, using prepared piano, and even pianos with quarter tone tuning... Nicolas Mondon's *Third Piano Sonata* was awarded the Chevillion-Yvonne Bonnaud Composition Prize as a result of Matthieu's performance at the Orléans Music Competition, one in which Matthieu won the André Jolivet and Ricardo Vines prizes. Additionally, he has won prizes in numerous international competitions, most notably for his performances of contemporary works.

An accomplished chamber musician, Matthieu created the Atopsys Duo in 2008 with the saxophonist Alexandre Souillard. The two have performed at the Palazzetto Bru-Zane's French Romantic Music Centre in Venice, at the Lima International Contemporary Music Festival (Peru), and on many European stages. In 2011, Atopsys won the Societa Umanitaria's Milan Competition. Matthieu is also an active member of the Ensemble *InSoliTus*.

Matthieu teaches piano at the Boulogne-Billancourt Conservatoire near Paris and in his native Normandy, and is a gifted arranger.

# Maroussia Gentet 2014 Scholarship Award

Gifted with the fiery energy of her namesake, the Ukrainian heroine of Pierre-Jules Stahl's novel, the precocious Maroussia Gentet entered Géry Moutier's piano class at the Lyon Conservatoire at the age of 13 and completed her high school diploma specializing in science a mere two years later.

Following completion of her Master's degree in 2009, she met the much soughtafter Russian pedagogue and pianist Rena Shereshevskaya – an encounter which was to prove decisive. She entered Shereshevskaya's class at Paris' Ecole Normale de Musique, completing the Advanced Performance Diploma there the following year.



Maroussia is currently completing the Paris Conservatoire's prestigious Artist Diploma course, working with the pianist Claire Désert. During this time, she has performed the Prokoviev *Piano Concerto No. 2* and Schumann's *Piano Concerto*, both with the Conservatoire's Graduate Orchestra. Her playing has been profoundly inspired by the artistry of Jean-Claude Pennetier.

Particularly attuned to the music of our time, Maroussia is also a fervent adept of classical and romantic repertoire, and in particular the works of Robert Schumann. Her talents have been recognized and supported by the Zaleski Foundation, the SPEDIDAM, the L'Or du Rhin Foundation, and she has been a prize-winner at numerous international competitions, notably Ferruccio Busoni (Bolzano, Italy, 2010).

Equally at home as a chamber musician and as a soloist, she is regularly invited to major musical seasons and festivals throughout France, and performs often at Paris' Salle Cortot and Cité de la Musique.

# Nathanaël Gouin 2014 Scholarship Award

« Tomorrow, Nathanaël Gouin will count as one of France's great pianists..." (Culture Box)

Nathanaël Gouin is a versatile musician, equally at home performing as a soloist, in chamber ensembles, accompanying and coaching singers, and composing.

Beginning piano and violin studies at the age of four, he was performing with Toulouse's Chamber Orchestra by ten.

Nathanaël obtained his Master's degree at the Paris Conservatoire in 2011 in Michel Béroff and Denis Pascal's studio. He is now completing the Artist Diploma Program



there, with a special focus on the work of Maurice Ohana. In 2010, the Carla Bruni-Sarkozy Foundation awarded him a scholarship for a semester at New York's Juilliard School.

Over the years, Nathanaël has perfected his artistry with Maria Joao Pires, Jean-Claude Pennetier, Menahem Pressler, Pierre-Laurent Aimard, Elisso Wirssaladze, Alexandre Rabinovitch, Eric Le Sage, and Christophe Eschenbach.

As a chamber musician, Nathanaël has performed in the Séverac Duo (violinpiano) with Guillaume Chilemme, and as a member of the Werther Trio, which he co-founded. Both groups have won prestigious prizes in international competitions in Austria, Sweden, Barcelona, and Lyon. His chamber activities have led him to perform with Jean-Claude Pennetier, Claire Désert, and the Voce Quartet, to name but a few.

As a soloist, he has performed with Toulouse's Orchestre National du Capitole and Mozart Orchestra, the South Bank Orchestra, and the Paris Conservatoire student orchestra.

# 2014 Financial Discussion

The overall 2014 operating budget should be viewed as a combination of cash donations and in-kind donations including:

- Cash donation from Members and Corporate patrons: \$19,926
- □ In-kind donations for a total estimated amount of \$17,600:
  - Three plane round-trip tickets donated by Air France (~ \$3,600)
  - 5 hotel nights donated by Sofitel New York (~\$1,000)
  - Recital venue donated by Consulate of France (~\$5,000)
  - Pro-bono work from the Directors and Executive Team to support the formation of the association and its operations, for an estimate of 120 hours or approximately \$5,000.
  - Grant Pianos are provided by Yamaha Artist Services and Steinway and Sons to our Benefit Recitals (~\$3,000)

The combination of both donation streams reflects strong level of support our program has gathered in its first year.

65% of our cash donations have been re-allocated to our Young Pianist U.S. Competition Scholarships. \$1,992.54 have been allocated to Legal and Administrative fees related to Artists Visas.

35% of our cash donations have been applied to the promotion of our Association and its related fundraising, mostly to our Benefit Recitals.

\$1,350 of "Membership Benefit" are related to the acquisition of thirty CDs from Pianist Hélène Tysman, which are given to select Members as part of their membership. There is a carry over of nine CDs for 2015.

Less than 5% of donations is used for Administrative purposes. We closed 2014 with \$58.29 dollars in our bank account.

Accounting is performed by Intuit Online, which is automatically synchronized with our OnLine Account at Bank of America, all backed up by could services. Each of our transaction is electronic and fully traceable.
